Author Guidelines

The 38th Annual Tennessee Fall Homecoming will be held on the beautiful grounds of the Museum of Appalachia, a Smithsonian Affiliate. Homecoming is one of the nation's largest folk, music, arts and crafts festivals which attracts thousands of visitors from almost every state, and many foreign countries. On unique outdoor stages, musicians will perform from 9am – 6pm (plus evening concerts). Homecoming also features several hundred old-time craftspeople, artisans and demonstrators. Included in Homecoming is Student Heritage Day, Friday, October, 6th, with the mission to educate thousands of young students about the lives and culture of the Appalachian people.

Author Requirements

- All work must be original and in-keeping with the Southern Appalachian region and heritage.
- Authors may sell only their own writings.
- You may sell only books/writings that are listed and approved on your application.

Booth Information

- Authors must furnish their own books and displays. Chairs and tables will be available in the designated Authors area. Each author is provided ½ (half) of a 6 (six) foot table and 1 chair. This area will be covered.
- The Museum of Appalachia will receive 15% of your total sales which is to be paid at the end of the day on Sunday, October 8, 2017.
- Tennessee State sales tax is the responsibility of each individual author.
- Authors should be prepared for sun, rain, cold and/or wind.
- Authors will receive a total of two name badges.
- No cars allowed on the grounds after 8:00 a.m.
- Sorry, no pets allowed on the grounds of the Museum of Appalachia.
- Electricity is not available.

Setup

All Authors must check in at the Information Tent before setup. Authors may begin setting up on Thursday, October 5, 2017 after 12:00 p.m. and/or each morning prior to 8:00 a.m.
